However, trying to explain the functioning of Gilead or the «rape», which we were told to stop explaining this word because it was too harsh for young students to fully understand. Moreover, we were warmly welcomed by the teacher who reassured us before the class started. We also decided to make a quiz and give the winners a treat in order to make them excited and focused. Emma (TG3) - Héloïse (TG4): This experience was very instructive. At the beginning of the session it was stressful but afterwards I would say that it was the students who made us feel comfortable and not the other way round. They were interested about what we were saying, They asked a lot of questions like "Why do maids not escape from this regime". This exchange was very pleasant and very enriching. In addition, to explaining a book like The handmaid's tale to 7th grade was not really easy because there are some words complicated like to explain "rape" or how Gilead works. They participate a lot sometimes they took the words out of our mouths, we could see that they had listened to us. It's been enjoyed to see little child entertained about this. When we do the quiz, they were even more excited. Everybody was playing and they all had the right answers. It's made us happy to see that. We really like to be in the place of a teacher, it's was unique and make us feel confident for the Grand Oral. At the end, We talked about the jobs we wanted to do later on. We saw how inspired they were and that they had many dreams. We saw ourselves through them when we were their age. They thanked us and it was nice to see.

Yanis-Ikram (TG2): This experience was cool, it was a special experience because we weren't used to talking with young people and even more so with an entire class. At the beginning it was a little awkward because we had to ask questions to them but we weren't inspired. But after this we get comfortable with them. The fact that they were participated maked our presentation easier. At the end we run out of time so we couldn't do the kahoot so we had to improvised and asked questions in oral. Children were very happy because we give them rewards to all of them. Fortunately we had the idea of asking after every single sentence if they understood so that we didn't have to restart what we were saying in french, and if someone didn't understand we ask to another child who understand what we were saying to explain to the others, so it was benefici for everyone.

Alexandre (TG4): We had to present the handmaids tale to a class of 7th graders. Even so they were young they were able to respond in a clever manner. Spending time with them was enjoyable because they participated a lot. They were very curious and they asked a lot questions. We tried to tell the story in A manner that they could understand we focused mainly on the dystopian aspect because they had talked about

it before with their teacher. Some students were shy but thanks to the Quiz they ended up being more comfortable. At the end of our presentation they asked us question our experience in high school. At the end I ws able to use example from real life and compare it with Gilead by quoting Margaret Atwood about how some horrible Act are done under the influence of an ideology that had nothing to do with it. I think the quiz was very their favorite part because they had become competitive in order to win some candies that my partner brought with her.

Meryem (TG6) :this experience was interesting because it allowed me to discover what a teacher's job is, I was quite stressed and the class was a little hectic, but it was still a very good experience and I have good memories of it. At first it was complicated because it was the first time I was speaking to a younger audience and they didn't participate much so I asked myself a lot of questions but in the end over time I felt a little more comfortable even if I remained quite tense.

Moyoriola (TG5): This experience was quite unique because we don't get to experience such things often. I'd say that it was quite hard at first trying to get comfortable talking in front of a younger audience. But I feel like it was easier at the end to get our point across. Overall, it was quite a learning experience and it will definitely help me in the future if I need to improvise or if I am in stressful situations that require courage!

However i really liked it because it was a great experience, i felt comfortable talking in front of them, my accent was quite good and I said everything i needed to say. Speaking in front of people is a hard task and

you can be easily overwhelmed by stress but fortunately I wasn't. Even if The Handmaid's Tale was not one of the book I appreciated the most I was capable of conveying the spirit of the book. It was a very enjoyable time because even though only a few students were participating it helped us to animate a bit the presentation. I take this as an inspiring experience especially because i plan on working with people and i will need to speak in front of multiple audience so I'm really grateful for this. Above all I use to go to this school so i was quite nostalgic and i had the chance to see the teachers i use to have.

Najate (TG6) - Malaika (TG2): We really enjoyed the time we spent with the students, it was a very inspiring and fruitful experience especially for my future professional project as I want to become a language teacher (Najate).
